CONVERSIONS" KITS, ANY OF THE AIRCRAFT ILLUSTRATED CAN BE MODELLED.

8-52D 55-677 was the only B-52 to carry the Sharkmouth emblem. Camouflage follows

- the kit instructions. There is a White 677 and cheat line on the outboard sides of the fuel tanks, SAC badge is to PORT, with Unit badge to STARBOARD.
- B-52F 57-169 carries the markings worn in Vietnam, during the Arc Light bombings, with glossy Black undersides. This aircraft could be modelled carrying AGM-28 Hound Dog missiles on it's inboard pylons, but would then wear the standard Aluminium/White colour scheme.
- B-52H 60-008 This well-known aircraft can be modelled using the "D.B. Conversions" for the H model, and took part in several RAF bombing competitions during the 6 B-52G 58-195 carries the latest Tactical Scheme, and illustrates the latest trend towards the use of nose art on SAC aircraft. The aircraft was displayed in the static line-up at the 1989 Fairford IAT airshow. The "D.B.Conversions" B-52G k: should be used to make this model. A suitable warload for this aircraft could consist of AGM-84A Harpoon missiles from the Hasegawa weapons packs carried on
- the underwing pylons.

 B-52H 61-040 was the lastB-52 built by the Boeing Wichita plant, and carries the latest Tactical scheme, with distinctive sea eagle tail markings. The finished model could carry AGM-89B Air Launched Cruise Missiles on it's underwing pylon obtained from a Monogram B-1 kit.
